The Office of Chief Trial Counsel is responsible for the intake, investigations, trials and prosecution of allegations of attorney misconduct and seeks Investigators.

The investigator investigates complaints of attorney misconduct made by the general public, courts and other parties. In addition, determine what evidence is needed to support the allegations, collects evidence, researches case and statutory law and interviews witnesses to determine the appropriate course of action. The distinguishing feature of the Investigator II, as contrasted to the Investigator I position, is that the Investigator II may also supervise and train the Investigator I and works on more complex cases.

Investigator I – Bachelor's degree, or equivalent work experience in a field that develops the skills required for the functions and responsibilities of the position, and Minimum two (2) years' experience in a position requiring extensive writing research and analysis, preferably in an investigative environment.

Investigator II – Bachelor's degree in a field that develops the skills related to investigation, or equivalent academic achievement, and Minimum four (4) years' experience in an investigative position.

Must be bondable, have valid California driver's license, and immediate, unlimited access to an automobile. Proof of automobile insurance coverage will be required at the time of employment.
