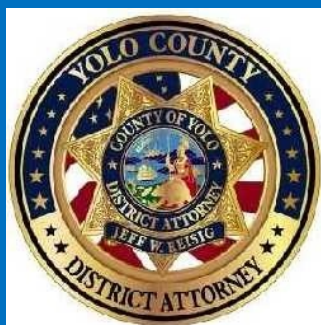

Identifying & Responding to Non-Fatal Strangulation Cases

Yolo County District Attorney Jeff Reisig and the Davis Police Department are pleased to welcome **Gael Strack**, from the **Training Institute on Strangulation Prevention** and **Dr. William Green**, from the **California Clinical Forensic Medical Training Center**, who are nationally recognized experts on the identification, investigation, and documentation of non-fatal strangulation assaults.

Strangulation has been identified as one of the most lethal forms of intimate partner violence; Unconsciousness can occur within seconds and death within minutes. When a perpetrator strangles a victim, not only is this a felonious assault, but it may be an attempted homicide. Strangulation is the ultimate form of power and control, where the perpetrator can demonstrate control over the survivor's next breath, with devastating psychological effects and a potentially fatal outcome.

You will learn: The lethality of strangulation; signs and symptoms; anatomy and medical aspects; best practices for investigation, evaluation and prosecution of strangulation events; advocacy for survivors and available resources from the **Training Institute on Strangulation Prevention**.
